Main activities and learning outcomes		Other activities
<p>Our final topic is based around our week long residential trip to Norfolk.</p> <p>All of the work we will be completing when we return to school will be linked to the experiences and visits of the school journey.</p> <p>Geography: We will be using maps to understand where we are visiting and the features of the landscape in Norfolk. We will also be learning about coastal erosion and the actions which can be taken to minimise the effects of the sea on the coastline. The children will see evidence of coastal erosion and sea defences when we visit Norfolk's beaches.</p> <p>Science: We will also be learning about habitats of plants and animals, in particular the seals which live on the Norfolk coast.</p>	<p>Art: We will be creating personal 'scrap book' style topic books to tell the story of our school journey.</p> <p>English/Drama: We will be working towards an end of year production. The children will be allocated roles - some will be on stage and others will be helping to co-ordinate the backstage aspects of lighting, sound and scenery. All of our hard work will result in a fantastic show to be presented in July.</p>	<p>There will be a number of events aimed at easing the transition to secondary school this half term. Staff from the various secondary schools will be visiting to meet the children and to answer any questions they may have. There will also be taster days when the children will attend their new school and take part in lessons.</p>
